Ha'Azinu - האזינו October 15, 2016 – 13 Tishrei 5777

Ha'azinu is a poem of 70 lines. Each verse consists of at least two lines that are parallel to each other in meaning.

In last week's parasha, Moses was commanded to write a song, containing Israel's experiences with God and the Torah, and warnings of what will happen if they abandon God's commandments. In this song, delivered on the last day of his life, Moses calls upon heaven and earth to be witnesses. Moses urges the people to consider their history and realize how special they are for all the things that God has done for them. He emphasizes that they will only find life and endure in the Land of Israel if they follow the Torah.

G-d then tells Moses to go up to Mount Nebo and, from there, view the entire land. But he will not be able to enter the land and will die on Mount Nebo.

Fun Facts for Sukkot

- I. RUSTIC ROOTS--Archaeologists have unearthed 5,000-yearold etrog seeds in ancient Mesopotamia (modern Iraq). An etrog is one of the four species that the Torah commands us to use in celebration of Sukkot (*Vayikra* 23:40).
- 2. BEDTIME BLESSING--The Talmud explains that if we see an etrog in a dream, it means that God considers us precious.
- 3. RITUAL RECYCLABLES--Pieces of dried etrog can be combined with cloves to enhance the spices used during *Havdalah*. Also, the *Iulav*--palm, willow, and myrtle branches--can be lit as kindling when we burn *hametz* before Pesach.
- 4. SMALLEST SUKKAH--Jewish legal scholars determined that a sukkah should be no smaller than 27"x27"--the smallest space a person could occupy while sitting or crouching at a table.
- 5. LOTSA LIGHTS--The Jerusalem Municipality and Israel Electric Company built the world's largest sukkah last year, stringing 2.5 miles of electrical wiring, which lit 144,000 miniature light bulbs.

This Day in Jewish History—13 Tishrei



In 2000, at the start of the Palestinian intifada, two Israeli reserve soldiers were brutally lynched at a Palestinian police station in Ramallah. The two had taken a wrong turn and ended up in the West Bank town where they were set upon by a crowd. Palestinian police officers stood by -- and some participated -- as the crowd beat, mutilated, burned and disemboweled the Israelis. The image of

one young man, waving to the crowd with bloodied hands, came to symbolize the vicious wave of terror that would claim over 1,000 Israeli lives.
