Parashat Kee Tetze

In Parashat Kee Tetze, Moses continues his instructions to the people of Israel, as they are about to enter the Promised Land.

This Parasha is loaded with Mitzvot—commandments, dos and don'ts—as if Moses wants to teach as much as he can on these last days of his life.

This Parasha contains 74 Mitzvot out of the 613 found in the Torah. They include laws on family life, laws requiring a finder to return an object to its rightful owner, and compassion and kindness to animals.

Emphasis is again placed on being kind and generous to those who are vulnerable—the poor, orphans, widows and strangers. Conduct during war and those who would be exempt from serving is also discussed.

The parasha concludes with the commandment of remembering Amalek. Amalek in the Torah represents an evil nation that attacked Israel when they left Egypt. The commandment urges us to always remember—ZACHOR—and to never forget what they did to our people. God promises that, someday, the remembrance of Amalek will be erased.

This Day in Jewish History—11 Elul

In 1950, Operation Magic Carpet, which secretly airlifted 45,000 Yemenite Jews to Israel, was concluded. Many of the Jews had never before seen an airplane; they likened the ride to a fulfillment of the biblical verse, "And I bore you on eagles' wings" (Exodus 19:4). According to tradition, Jews had lived in Yemen since the 7th century BCE. Upon arriving in Israel they were housed in tent camps; there was very little infrastructure and resources to accommodate them, as the Jewish population of Israel nearly doubled in its first three years. Yet within a short time, the immigrants had been absorbed into the fledgling Israeli society.
