B'reysheet - בראשית
October 26, 2019—27 Tishrei 5780

This Shabbat we begin the cycle of reading from the Torah. We start from the very beginning—B'reysheet, the Beginning. It is the story of creation. We don't have many details as to how or why God created heaven and earth. From this week's parasha, it would seem that the two most important creations are the creation of humans and the establishment of the Shabbat.

The creation takes place in stages—in our language, divided over six days. When all things have been created the Torah tells us that God ceased from all work on Shabbat and made the day holy. God blessed and sanctified the Shabbat Day.

For the benefit of humans, God creates the Garden of Eden where man is tested. Adam and Eve fail and they are chased from Eden. From now on, they will have to work hard for the land to provide food. It's a small family, but already there is rivalry and strife between the two brothers, Cain and Abel, and Cain murders his brother. Cain is asked by God, "Where is your brother," and Cain responds, "Am I my brother's keeper?"

By the end of this parasha, the universe is pretty corrupt, which will lead us to the only man worth saving—Noah—next week.

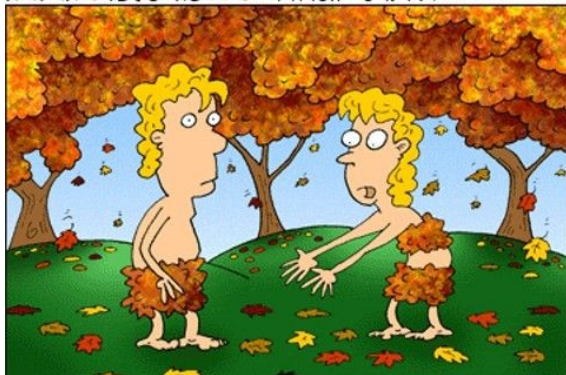

On This Day: 27 Tishrei



In 1927, the Israeli city of Netanya was founded on a plot of empty land. Netanya has since grown to become the fourth-largest city in Israel, with a population of 165,000. Netanya has one of the most beautiful stretches of beach in Israel, with white sands and inviting waters. Netanya was named for Nathan Straus (1848-1931), an American merchant and philanthropist. Straus was a co-owner of R.H. Macy & Co., yet he never amassed personal wealth

because he was always using his money to help people. For example, in New York's winter of 1893, he gave away more than two million five-cent tickets good for coal, food or lodging. His greatest devotion, however, was to Israel. He gave more than two-thirds of his fortune and devoted the last 15 years of his life to this cause.
